Its best to either keep them on the same diet they had at the breeder, or to gradually introduce new foods while consulting with the animals veterinarian.At the six-month point, reduce their diet to twice a day. Due to their susceptibility to food allergies, you should proceed with caution and close monitoring as you make these dietary modifications for your Berner pet.Health problems & issuesThere is an increased risk of cancer in Bernese dogs compared to other dog breeds. Furthermore, musculoskeletal disorders are a leading cause of death among this population. Ramps and wheelchair access in vehicles and dwellings are two solutions to this problem. A comfortable dog bed may also alleviate the dogs arthritic problems.ConclusionThey have a life expectancy of 6-9 years. Love, strength, and affection have made them live longer than that.
