Massachusetts Driver's License Requirements for Minors Every resident who operates a motor vehicle in the state can apply for a driver's license if they are at least 16 years old and have a valid permit. To obtain a Class D or M driver's license, applicants must hold their permit for six months and complete a driver education training program. A vision exam and written learner's permit test must be passed before issuing a permit. To apply for a junior operator license (JOL), applicants must meet certain requirements, such as having a clean driving record, completing a registrar-approved driver education program, and passing a road test. Minors under 18 years old are subject to certain restrictions, including not carrying passengers under 18 unless accompanied by a licensed driver of at least 21. Applicants must also provide required documents, such as proof of residency and identity, and complete a vision exam. [Given article text here](#) To obtain a CDL permit in Massachusetts, individuals must pass multiple-choice questions covering general knowledge, air brakes, and combination vehicles. In contrast, motorcycle licenses are available with restrictions at age 16, provided parental consent is given. A learner's permit can be obtained at this age, followed by completion of a Rider Education Program or passing the RMV road test to secure a full license.
