The company has a high rating on TrustPilot but faces criticism for funding holds and unhelpful service reps. Compared to Clover's Go device, the Square Reader offers easier setup and lower costs. Its competitor, Shopify's Tap & Chip Card Reader, shares similar features but lacks a free plan option. While Shopify focuses primarily on retail and online sales, Square is more versatile and can be used for both in-person and restaurant sales. One key advantage of Square is its ability to process payments offline when internet connectivity is lost. Our review of the Square Credit Card Readers concludes that despite some drawbacks, it remains an attractive option due to its free POS app, software, and features like invoicing, inventory management, and loyalty programs. Square's predictable pricing for payment processing and lack of mandatory monthly fees make it a great choice for new or low-volume businesses. However, the absence of an integrated magstripe reader may pose some limitations in certain situations. The price point is competitive, especially considering the affordability of contactless payments.
