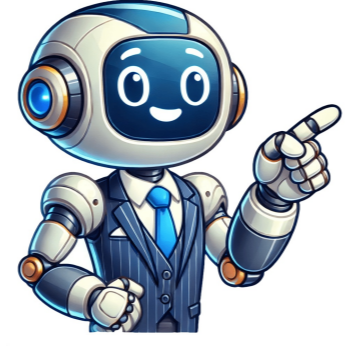


I'm human





Enter the eerie realm of Anthony Horowitz's twisted tales, where three spine-tingling stories await. For Gary, the countryside holds only despair; he despises its emptiness. Yet, something sinister lurks within the rural landscape - perhaps a malevolent force that shares his disdain? Kevin is enthralled by computer games, but the latest release defies all conventions and revels in ruthlessness. Meanwhile, Howard's existence seems idyllic, yet beneath the surface lies a sense of foreboding. A Study Guide provides insight into Anthony Horowitz's mastery of scary storytelling. The collection, "Scared," is comprised of three chilling tales that delve into themes of isolation, bullying, bribery, selfishness, struggle, and hatred. In the story "Gary Wilson was lost" (11), a sense of desolation is evoked, suggesting a negative statement. An antonym for "tired" could be "energetic." The reader knows Gary's difficulties navigating the field through his physical descriptions and actions. His appearance can be depicted as scrawny with a scowl on his face. Gary's mother says "of course" (12) to imply that paying back those who wronged him is a natural consequence of his actions. This suggests that Gary is aware of his own moral decay. He is portrayed as a bully, using intimidation and manipulation to get what he wants. The death of his father affects Gary by leaving him without guidance or a male figure in his life. Gary's mother takes him on holiday to the countryside to provide him with an escape from the city's dangers. However, Gary misses the excitement of urban life and feels trapped in the rural setting. Despite this, he doesn't sense any magic in the countryside (17), instead perceiving it as isolating and devoid of purpose. The study guide highlights themes such as isolation, bullying, bribery, selfishness, struggle, and hate that are present throughout Horowitz's collection. In "Scared," Anthony Horowitz explores the theme of isolation, particularly through Gary's experiences at Pye Hall. This isolated setting contrasts sharply with Gary's preference for the city, where he can torment his classmates. Gary's character is further complicated by his family dynamics - his grandmother and mother adore him despite his selfish nature. Critics might argue that his father's death has contributed to his lack of empathy towards others. Gary bullies both his mother and grandmother, using bribery to get what he wants. His complete disregard for the feelings of those around him makes him a difficult character to like. The absence of a male figure in Gary's life adds to his troubled personality, making it challenging for his mother to live with him and manage his behavior. Gary's struggles to care for his mother and dominate his family home may be connected to his dislike of visiting his grandmother, where rules are likely different. Despite this, Gary detests his environment and has created obstacles for himself by being a bully. The route he takes when lost mirrors the challenges he's placed on his life. His grandmother serves as a foil, caring for people unlike Gary, who only looks out for himself. A wasp that follows him foreshadows trouble, and its sting symbolizes impending doom. When Gary twists his ankle, it not only hinders his physical journey but also stunts any hope of change. The story concludes with Gary's death in the field, where he's mistakenly identified as a scarecrow. While some may lament his demise, others will be glad to see an obnoxious bully receive comeuppance. However, this outcome raises questions about everyone having redeeming qualities, even if they're difficult to see in Gary.
