Premier league stadium map

Before FA Cup semi-finals were moved to Wembley, many were held at Villa Park due to its central location in the country. The teams are fairly evenly spread around Spain with clusters in Madrid, Barcelona, Seville and the Basque Country. Bramley-Moore Dock is now the seventh largest stadium in the English top flight and is also ranked highly among the most beautiful stadiums in the league. Currently, Old Trafford has a capacity of 74,874. It was also used by the rugby league club Hunslet in the mid-1980s and hosted the 2015 Rugby World Cup. It was founded by Arnold Hills — director of the Thames Ironworks shipyard department — to improve the relationship between management and workers. The VIP lounge is also an improvement over what was available at Goodison Park, and ticket prices at Bramley-Moore will be slightly higher than what Everton fans have previously paid. It has been Newcastle United's grounds since 1892 and has been grounds for football since 1880. Barcelona's Nou Camp is the largest football stadium in Europe with a capacity of 99,000, that's over five times larger than Getafe's Coliseum Alfonso Pérez which has a capacity of 17,000.
