Enable or Fix Your Toshiba Laptop Touchpad If it's Not Working ProperlyIf your specific touchpad features are not working properly, such as scrolling or pinch-to-zoom, click here to learn how to change the touchpad settings for specific features and gestures. If the touchpad is not working at all, ensure that the device is enabled.To enable or disable the touchpad, you'll need to check your laptop model's specifications. For more information, see the following article: Enable or Disable the TouchpadIf enabling the touchpad doesn't resolve the issue, try uninstalling the touchpad driver and rebooting your laptop to reinstall the driver.\* Windows 10 and Windows 8: Hold the Windows key and press the 'x' key to open a menu in the lower-left. Select "Device Manager."\* Windows 7 and Windows Vista: Open the Start Menu and type "Device Manager" in the search field. Select "Device Manager" from the results. In Device Manager, select Mice and other pointing devices, then right-click on touchpad entries and select Uninstall.After the driver uninstalls, reboot your computer. The driver will install automatically. If that doesn't help, try manually downloading the newest touchpad driver from the Toshiba Support site.Use the "Touchpad" filter as well as the filter for your version of Windows. Most newer Toshiba laptops use the 64-bit version of Windows.Finding Support DocumentsOnce you've installed the correct drivers, check Windows Update for updates as well. If reinstalling the driver doesn't resolve the issue, try performing a system restore to a date before the issue occurred.You can perform a system restore in:\* Windows 10: System Restore\* Windows 8: System Restore\* Windows 7: System RestoreIf your laptop has an unresponsive touchpad, you may also want to try a power cycle. Shut down your laptop, remove all accessories, and unplug all cables. If your laptop has a user-removable battery, remove the battery.Hold the power button for 30 seconds, then reconnect the power and battery (if you removed it), turn on the laptop, and try again.To resolve touchpad issues on your laptop, start by using either the Free or Pro version of Driver Easy and scanning your computer for outdated drivers. This will guide you through the process of updating your drivers and potentially fix the problem.If the issue persists, check if the Touchpad is enabled on your laptop keyboard. Pressing the Fn key and the F9 key simultaneously should re-enable it. Ensure that you have the correct driver for your operating system.In some cases, you might need to troubleshoot issues with your Toshiba keyboard instead. Try enabling the keyboard, forcing a shutdown, cleaning dust from the keys, or uninstalling and reinstalling the drivers. You can also update the keyboard driver, disable Filter Keys, and check for Windows 10 updates.If none of these steps work, it's possible that you have hardware issues with your touchpad. Contact Toshiba support or take your laptop to an authorized service provider for further assistance.Stop working at the startup. Hence, it is worth a shot to get rid of the problematic Toshiba keyboard driver and then reinstall or update it for Windows. To do this follow steps:1. In Device Manager, Then, expand Keyboards and right click the Toshiba keyboard driver to Uninstall device. 3. Then confirm to uninstall the keyboard driver.The time you uninstalled the keyboard driver, you are supposed to reinstall it in device manager. 4. On the top of Device Manager, hit Actions > Scan for hardware changes. You will observe the presence of Toshiba keyboard driver again. Try to use the keyboard to check whether Toshiba keyboard not typing persists.If reinstalling the keyboard driver failed to turn Toshiba laptop keyboard back to function, it is suggestible that you make full use of Driver Booster to find and install the latest Toshiba drivers for Windows 10 automatically. Here Driver Booster is able to detect your keyboard driver is outdated, missing, or corrupted and then recommend the newest one to you.To do this follow:1. Download, install and run Driver Booster. 2. Hit the Scan button. Driver Booster will immediately start searching for outdated device drivers, including your Toshiba laptop keyboard drivers.3. Find out Keyboards and then Update it automatically by Driver Booster.Tips: How to Fix Toshiba Keyboard Code 37 Error? Not limited to code 37, if you find any code error with the keyboard in device manager, it is wise to resort to Driver Booster to fix this keyboard error automatically. On the left pane of Driver Booster, click Tools and then Fix Device error on the right side. Then click Detect to let Driver Booster scan for device manager error codes.It is possible that the newly installed driver will enable your Toshiba laptop keyboard to type and work on Windows 10. It is a common phenomenon that Toshiba laptop keyboard keys not working as the Filter keys are turned on. These Filter key can ignore or slow down brief or repeated keystrokes and adjust keyboard repeat rates but can also disrupt your keyboard keys.Now you might as well decide to disable the filter keys.1. Navigate to Start > Settings > Ease of Access. 2. Then scroll down to locate Keyboard and then switch off Filter keys. Without the filter keys on, Toshiba laptop keyboard problem will have been removed and unlocked successfully.It is also said that Microsoft has released updates to make the system more compatible and powerful. In normal cases, there will be repairing packages and new features added in the updates. From this perspective, it is a necessity to install Windows 10 updates.1. Head to Start > Settings > Update & Security. 2. Under Windows Update, choose to Check for updates. Take time to get the updating package on your Toshiba satellite laptops.In summary, speaking of this Toshiba laptop keyboard not working on Windows 10, 8, 7, you can get down to the Toshiba driver, keyboard settings, and hardware as well.Disable keyboard and enable touchpad: keys are good ways to disable the keyboard immediately if you spill a drink on keyboard to avoid any short circuit.There is no specific Function Key used for the enabling or disabling of the touchpad as it is different based on the brand or model of the laptop computer.Look for a Function Key with an image of a touchpad.Press the Key and there may be some form of visual or audio response that the touchpad was enabled or disabled.If there is no indication, try using the touchpad after pressing the Function Key to determine if it was enabled.For some laptop computers, the Fn key has to be pressed and held before pressing the specific Function Key.If a key is not working initially, try pressing the Fn key simultaneously.This will generally resolve the issue unless your keyboard has issues like when you press a key two letters appear.Solution 2: Enable Touchpad from Control PanelOpen the Control Panel from the Start MenuIn the Control Panel window:If the items are displayed as categories:Click on Hardware and SoundOn the Hardware and Sound page, click on Mouse found under the Devices and Printers headingIf the items are displayed as icons, click on MouseIn the Mouse Properties window, select the Touchpad tab(N.B.: Based on the brand and model of the computer, the name of the tab may include the name of the manufacturer of the touchpad hardware, such as Dell Touchpad.On the Touchpad tab, there will be a link that leads to the installed Touchpad Software.There should be a toggle switch or a checkbox to enable or disable the touchpad.Enable the touchpad if it is disabled.Along with the touchpad, sometimes I temporarily disable the laptop keyboard and use a wireless keyboard Solution 3: Enable Touchpad from BIOS SettingsFor many modern laptop computers, certain computer hardware can be disabled or enabled from the BIOS, including the Touchpad device for some computers.Once disabled from the BIOS, the Touchpad will not at all be identified by the Operating System.Enter the BIOS of the laptop computer during the booting process.The keypress to enter the BIOS is different based on the brand and model of the computer.Refer to the instruction Manual or use the website to find out how to access the BIOS on your laptop computer.Once you have opened the BIOS settings, navigate to any Hardware Settings and enable the Touchpad if it is disabled.Navigation is different for the different brands and models of laptop computers, so seek technical assistance if unsure.For example, If you face a problem with an Asus laptop, lets say your Asus laptop keyboard not working inside windows and you need to access BIOS, press and hold the [F2] button.Press the [Power button].Do not release the F2 button until the BIOS configuration displaySolution 4: Reinstall Touchpad Driver SoftwareOpen the Control Panel from the Start MenuIn the Control Panel window:If the items are displayed as categories:Click on System and SecurityOn the System and Security page, click on SystemOn the System page, click on Device Manager found in the Left PanelIf the items are displayed as icons, click on Device ManagerIn the Device Manager window, expand the Human Interface Devices categoryDouble-click the name of the Touchpad, such as Dell TouchpadIn the Touchpad Properties window, select the Driver tabOn the Driver tab, click the Uninstall buttonIn the Confirm Device Uninstall window, ensure that the Delete the driver software for this device checkbox is untickedClick the OK button and follow the instructionsSolution 5: Install Generic Touchpad Driver SoftwareCheck Solution 4 above (Steps 1-4) for directions to open the Touchpad Properties windowIn the Touchpad Properties window, select the Driver tab2. Updating the Touchpad Driver Software to the latest version, if available, may resolve the problem.To update your touchpad driver, check Solution 6: Update Touchpad Driver Software (Windows). First, you need to open the Update Driver Software window for the Touchpad. Then, click on Search automatically for updated driver software. If there is an updated Driver, it will be installed automatically. However, if there is no updated Driver, it will display the best driver software for your device is already installed.If Windows determines that there is no updated Driver software available, you can manually check and verify on the Internet. Visit the official website of your laptop computers manufacturer (HP, Dell, Acer, etc.) to check for, and download and install if possible, any updated Touchpad Driver software. If none of the solutions provided above have resolved the issue, then the problem could be a result of a hardware error or malfunction of the touchpad.In this case, you may need to seek technical assistance from either a certified Computer Technician or Electrician for professional assessment and repair or replacement of the touchpad. Many of you may be using a Toshiba laptop, and if your Toshiba laptop keyboard and touchpad are not working properly, there are some tips that might help you solve this issue.One reason for the touchpad not working correctly is any other issue with the laptop. To fix this, try rebooting your laptop. You can also enable the accidentally disabled dashboard by pressing the Fn and F9 keys simultaneously. This may resolve the issue. Additionally, updating your touchpad driver can help to resolve the problem.If the above points dont work then you might be having hardware issues with your touchpad. In this case, you may need to take your laptop to the authorized service provider for professional assessment and repair or replacement of the touchpad. If you are facing issues with your Toshiba laptop keyboard and it is not working properly, there are some steps that you can follow to fix the issue.One reason for the keyboard not working correctly is any connection issue or fault. After reconnecting, check whether it is working or not. You can also reinstall the keyboard Driver by uninstalling it first and then following the below step. Searching and opening the Device Manager window may help to resolve the issue.Double-click the keyboard to zoom in and right-click the keyboard, then select Remove/uninstall Device.Reinstall program.Then restart your laptop to check if your keyboards work now. STEP 3 You can update your keyboard driver. STEP 4 You can start fixing this by modifying the settings for filter keys also. You have to do this by clicking keyboard settings by visiting the control panel. I have Toshiba E55T - A5320, Windows 8.1 x64; neither the keyboard nor touchpad work since problem started suddenly; no changes had been made to system. Device manager shows exclamation marks next to PC/AT Enhanced PS/2 Keyboard (101/102 Key) ELAN PS/2 SMBus Port Input Device both. I've uninstalled them both multiple times, rebooted, but didn't fix it. System restore fixed it temporarily; issue came back after another reboot or two. I did drivers from Toshiba's site for the ELAN Touchpad and installed them, removed battery and power cord, let it sit for 30 minutes, but keyboard & mouse still not working.I've seen this before with machines losing keyboard and/or mouse, typically bad keyboard, stuck key issue.Disconnecting keyboard might help. To fix issue, try enabling touchpad by pressing Fn key and F9 key at the same time. Check if it's enabled, update driver according to Windows OS, and if none works, replace touchpad.Conclusion: I have provided a guide about Toshiba laptop keyboard and touchpad not working. Follow these steps to fix this issue.
