You can use the Family Link App to create a Google Account for your child under 13 (or the applicable age in your country). You can also use Family Link to add supervision to your child's existing Google Account. Important: Family Link may not be available in all countries or regions. iPhones, iPads, and computers other than Chromebooks can't be supervised with Family Link. Google Workspace for Education accounts can't be managed by Family Link. Family Link's purchase approval settings only apply to purchases made through Google Play's billing system. How account management works Google services & your child's Google Account If your child has a Google Account, they can use a variety of Google services. Keep in mind that these services generally aren't designed for children. Requirements Manage your child's Google Account To use Family Link to manage your child's Google Account, you need to: Have a Google Account. If you don't have one you can create a Google Account at no charge. Be 18 or older (or the appropriate age in your country) and have a Google Account. Have an Android device (6.0+), iPhone or iPad (iOS 16+), or a Chromebook that supports Android Apps to download the Family Link app. You can also manage some settings at familylink.google.com. Live in the same country as your child. Supervise your child's device To use Family Link to supervise your child's device, the child needs to: Have a Google Account. Have an Android device (6.0+), a Chromebook (running Chrome OS 71 or higher), or a compatible Fitbit device. Learn how to update your Android or Chrome OS version. Set screen time limits Open the Family Link app . At the top left, select your child. At the bottom left, tap Screen time Time limits. Turn on Daily limit. Tap Weekly schedule. For first time set up, tap Edit each day. Select a day. Enter how much screen time the device is limited to. To apply limits on all days of the week, tap Apply to all days of the week Done. Tip: To turn off screen time limit for a specific day, select a day and turn off Daily limit ON. To go to the child's account settings that you last visited in the Family Link app, tap the button below: Change daily limits On your device, open Family Link . At the top left, select your child. At the bottom left, tap Screen time Time limits Weekly schedule. For first time set up, tap Edit each day. Select a day. Enter how much screen time the device is limited to. To apply limits on all days of the week, tap Apply to all days of the week Done. Tip: You can edit the weekly schedule and change the limit on any selected day. You can let your child spend more time on their device for the day without changing their daily limit or downtime, school time schedule. You can add bonus time while your child's Android device is locked or soon to be locked. Open the Family Link app . At the top left, select your child. At the bottom left, tap Screen time . Below your child's device name, tap Bonus time . Set the amount of bonus time. To increase bonus time, select . To decrease the bonus time, select . To set a specific time, tap the number. Tap Done. With your child's device On your child's device, open Settings . On Android versions 8.1 (O) and later, tap Digital Wellbeing & parental controls. On other Android versions, tap Google Parental controls. To check the current settings, tap Daily limit. To edit Daily limit settings, sign in or use your Parent Access Code to verify that you're a parent. Tip: Daily limits apply to each Android device or Chromebook your child uses. For example, if you set a daily limit of 2 hours, your child would get 2 hours of time on each device. Allow or block apps In about 5 minutes, or once the device is connected to the Internet, the app will be locked or unlocked. If your child is using the app when you block it, they'll get a one minute warning to finish up before the app is blocked. The app is blocked on all of your child's Android devices or Chromebooks. Important: Some apps can't be blocked because they're required for parent supervision settings to work, or for your child's device to work. Open the Family Link app . Select your child. At the bottom left, tap Screen time Time limits App limits. Review the list of apps. Apps that are blocked are marked as Blocked . Apps that are allowed don't have this icon. To block or allow an app: To block an app: Select the app. Tap on the Allowed toggle. The app status changes to Blocked . Tap Done. To allow an app: Select the app. Tap on the Blocked toggle. The app status changes to Allowed . Tap Done. Find your child's location To go to the child's account settings that you last visited in the Family Link app, tap the button below: Find your child's location If you're a parent, you can find your child's Android device location in the Family Link app. Open the Family Link app . Tap Location. Tap Set up location. If you have multiple children, select which ones you want to turn on location sharing for. Tap Turn on. You can share purchased apps, games, movies, TV shows, and e-books and audiobooks from Google Play with up to 5 family members using Google Play Family Library. Sign up for Family Library Important: If you aren't part of a family group, you must create one first. Open the Google Play app . At the top right, tap the profile icon. Tap Settings Family Sign up for Family Library. Follow the instructions on screen to set up Family Library. Note: Everyone in your family needs to follow the instructions above to set up Family Library. Requirements If you are not part of a family already, you'll become the family manager when you sign up for Family Library. Family managers must meet all these requirements: Be 18 or older (or the appropriate age in your country) Have a valid credit card or debit card to use as the family payment method Not be part of another family group on Google Note: You can't create a family with a Google Account from your work, school, or other organization. Family member requirements To join a family group, you must meet these requirements: Countries Family Library is available in most countries that you can use Google Play. Add or remove Family Library purchases Eligible purchases can be automatically added to the Family Library, or you can add them yourself after you buy them. Apps & games, Movies & TV shows, and Books sharing with Family Library may be limited in some countries. When you remove purchases from Family Library or leave your family group, your family members lose access to the purchases you added to Family Library. Important: Movies or TV shows: To avoid potential issues when you add content to Family Library, use the family payment method instead of your personal credit or debit card to purchase. Books, Apps, or Games: Eligible for Family Library with any form of payment, as long as: There's a family credit card on file. The family credit card is still valid. Family sharing is turned on. Add or remove individual purchases Open the Google Play app . At the top right, tap the profile icon. Tap Manage apps & devices Installed. Tap a purchased app or game you want to add. On the content's details page, turn on Family Library. To remove the content, turn off Family Library. Movies & TV shows Open the Play Movies & TV app . At the bottom, tap Library. Under the "Movies" or "TV shows" tab, look for purchased content you want to add. On the content's details page, turn on Family Library. Note: When you add TV shows from the Play Movies & TV app, you're adding all episodes of the show. If you want to add or remove certain seasons or episodes that were purchased separately, search for the content in the Play Store app and add it to Family Library from the episode or show's details page. Books Open the Play Books app . At the bottom, tap Library. Look for the e-books or audiobooks you want to add. Press and hold the book title. Scroll down to add to Family Library. To remove the content, press and hold the book title. Then scroll to Remove from Family Library. Change your Family Library settings By default, eligible purchases are automatically added to your Family Library after you create or join a family group. To change the Family Library settings, or remove all purchase of a certain type: Open the Google Play app . At the top right, tap the profile icon. Tap Settings Family Family Library settings. Select Apps & Games, Movies & TV, or Books. Tap Don't add automatically, I'll do it myself, or Add items automatically when purchased Yes, I'm in . Restrict content for certain family members Everyone in your family group can see all the content that's been added to Family Library. You can set up parental controls to restrict the content family members can see. See Family Library content Open the Google Play app . At the top right, tap the profile icon. Tap Settings Family Family Library settings. Select Apps & Games, Movies & TV, or Books. Tip: If a tab isn't listed, your family members haven't added any content in that category. Open the Google Play Movies & TV app . At the bottom, tap Library. Tap the Movies or TV Shows tab. Scroll down to the "Family Library" list. If you don't see a "Family Library" list, your family members haven't added anything to your Family Library yet. Note: Movies can be played offline on up to 5 devices per family member and 12 devices per family. 6 movies can be played at once, but each movie can only be streamed by one person at a time. Books Open the Google Play Books app . At the bottom, tap Library. Tap the Family tab. If you don't see a "Family" tab, it means your family members haven't added any books to your Family Library yet. Note: Each book can be downloaded on up to 6 devices at the same time. When someone removes a book from their device, it becomes available for other family members to download. See if content is eligible to be added to Family Library Most purchased apps, games, movies, TV shows, and books can be added to your Family Library. If an item is eligible to be added, you'll see the Family Library icon on the content's details page. Movies & TV shows Any movies or TV shows you purchased before your Family Library was created can be added to Family Library. After you sign up for Family Library or join someone's family group, new movie and TV show purchases can only be added if you purchase them with the family payment method, a Google Play gift card, or a promo code. Movies Movies sharing with Family Library may be limited in some countries. If you purchase a bundle of movies, you can only add or remove an entire bundle from your Family Library, but not individual movies. You can't add Play movie rentals or movies purchased on YouTube to Family Library. TV shows TV shows sharing with Family Library may be limited in some countries. You can't add TV show rentals to Family Library. You can't add TV shows purchased in YouTube. TV shows aren't available in all countries. Apps & games Apps & games sharing with Family Library may be limited in some countries. You can't share in-app purchases and apps downloaded at no charge with your family members. Any apps or games purchased after July 2, 2016 are eligible to be added to Family Library. If you purchased the app or game before July 2, 2016, it's eligible for Family Library if the developer has made past purchases available. To find out if it's eligible to be added to Family Library: Tap About this game/app. At the bottom, under "More info," it will say "Eligible for Family Library" if it's eligible. Books If the book publisher allows for e-books or audiobooks to be added to Family Library, you can share it with your family members. You can't add samples provided at no charge, public domain books, personal documents you uploaded, or books you rented to Family Library. Books can only be added to Family Library in certain countries. Newsstand Newsstand purchases can't be added to Family Library. Troubleshoot problems I got an error when creating my family Learn how to troubleshoot errors when creating your family group. Content was removed from Family Library If someone removes content from the Family Library, if they leave the family group entirely, or if your family group is deleted, you have to purchase the content in order to use it. Once you purchase it, you'll pick up where you left off. If you bought in-app purchases in a game, you'll get those back after you purchase the game. I purchased content, but I can't add it to Family Library If you can't add content you bought to Family Library, it might be because: The content isn't eligible to be added to Family Library. You used your personal credit or debit card instead of the family payment method to purchase the movie or TV show. "Your family payment method is invalid" If you see this message, your family payment method is invalid. If you're the family manager, update your family payment method to a valid credit card so that you and your family members can add purchases to Family Library. While the family payment method is invalid, purchases made using other forms of payment won't be automatically added to Family Library. After your family payment method is updated, you'll need to manually add those items to Family Library from the details page. Post to the help community Get answers from community members To find your friends and family, you can use the Find Hub app to: Share your location with others Find others' location on a map Take a few different actions for those shares Set up your Find Hub app To set up your Find Hub app on your device: Sign in to the Find Hub app. Grant app location permissions to display a blue dot on your map and calculate friends' distance from you. If you don't grant the Find Hub app location permission, you can still use the app to find your lost devices and to share your location, but you won't be able to see your blue dot. Start & stop a share Start a share If you don't have any shares, to get started, tap Start share. You can find a preview of the information that you can share with your recipient, like: Location Name Avatar Address Battery percentage Choose the duration of the share you want to start from either: One hour Until the end of the day (ends at 11:59 PM user's time) Until you stop the share A custom duration Choose one or multiple people from your recipients by: Using the suggested list: To start your share, tap Create share. You can search for specific contacts with the magnifying glass within the pre-populated list. If the recipient's device has the Find Hub app or Google Maps installed and notifications on, they'll receive a notification to let them know that you shared your location with them. If they don't, they'll receive an email. Sharing with a link Choose your selected duration and tap Get link to share. This opens up a way for you to choose commonly used apps, message threads, and other groups to send the link with. Anyone with the link can see your location and other personal information. "Until you stop" shares can't be created as a link share. Tip: If you already have shares on your account in other Google apps, like Maps, Family Link, or Personal Safety, you can view them in Find Hub automatically. Stop a share Tap on the user you'd like to stop sharing with. Tap the "Stop sharing" button. From the confirmation dialog, you can either: Cancel: Your share stays and you go back to the details page. Confirm: If the user is also sharing with you, you'll stay on the contact detail page and the button will no longer be blue. You can start a new share as if you want. If you're the only one sharing, you'll be sent back to the list of shares. On your device, you can also manage your location shares through Find Hub. Under "Location Sharing" tab, on the top right, select your profile Location Sharing settings. Tips: Location shares are associated with your account. If you stop a share, it stops for your account, and for all apps using Google Location Sharing, including Find Hub. You can also manage your shares in other Google location sharing apps, such as Google Maps. You can also manage your locations shares in your Google Location Sharing settings page: On your Android device, open Settings. Tap Location Location Services Google Location Sharing. Actions you can take per share Get directions Tap on the user you'd like to get directions to Get directions. Google Maps will open with a route to that person's location. If the user keeps moving, the route won't continue to update since this is a one-time direction only. Hide a user Tap the user you'd like to hide More . Select Hide from map. On the confirmation dialogue pop-up, confirm if you want to hide the selected person. You can also stop sharing with that person or not with the checkmark. You'll be sent back to the list of shares with a confirmation. To find the people you hid from your map: Scroll to the bottom of your list of shares. On the right of "Hidden from Map," tap Arrow down . To unhide someone from your map: Scroll to the bottom of your list of shares. On the right of "Hidden from Map," tap Arrow down . Tap the user you'd like to unhide. Tap More . Select Unhide from map. Block a user Tap the user you'd like to block. Tap More . Select Block. From the confirmation dialog, select "Confirm" if you want to block the person. You'll be sent back to the list of shares with a confirmation afterwards. If you want to unblock someone, on your Google account, visit your Blocklist. Tip: When you block a person, it also applies to a variety of Google apps and services, like Photos and Maps. Learn how to block or unblock people's accounts. Refresh You can manually refresh a person's location. To do this: Tap the user whose location you'd like to refresh. Tap More . Select Refresh. The dropdown menu will collapse and you'll find a progress indicator until: Timestamp changes to "now": The person's location is updated. Timestamp didn't change: The person's location wasn't retrieved possibly due to: Their device was either offline or turned off. Location services were turned off. Location sharing was turned off. Tip: The person's location will also be automatically refreshed while you use the app. How to use and understand your list of shares Manage your list and map To manage your list and map, you can: Use Filtering. Sharing with you: You can find people who share their location with you. It includes people you're not sharing back and people you're sharing back with. You're sharing with: You can find people you're sharing your location with. It includes people who aren't sharing back with you and people who are sharing back with you. Neither: You can view all of your shares, including incoming, outgoing, and people you are sharing with who are also sharing with you. Tip: You can't select both filters at the same time. Center your location within the map. If you grant Find Hub access to your location, you can center your location within your map view. At the bottom right corner of the map, tap the My Location . Use the + button to start a new share. How to read the list Map It shows the people who share their location with you and aren't hidden. Hidden list If you hide a user from appearing on your map, they'll be placed in a collapsible list at the bottom of the list of shares. You can unhide them: Select their name. In their contact details page, from the overflow menu, unhide them. Tips: Whether or not your child can control their own account settings doesn't change the settings themselves. It's recommended for parents to make sure the settings are correct after they change this control. You can also manage these settings from g.co/yourFamily. 2-Step Verification for your child's account If your child has 2-Step Verification turned on for their account, 2-Step Verification gets turned off.
